

Maundy Thursday (3:30 service) April 1, 2021

PRE-SERVICE READING

Matthew 26:17-19

On the first day of the Festival of Unleavened Bread, the disciples came to Jesus and Asked, "Where do you want us to make preparations for you to eat the Passover.?" He replies, "Go into the city to a certain man and tell him 'The teacher says: My appointed time is near. I am going to celebrate the Passover with my disciples at your house.'" So the disciples did as Jesus had directed them and prepared the Passover.

MAUNDY THURSDAY INVITATION

P: For four hundred years, the Jewish people suffered in slavery in Egypt. When God delivered them through his servant, Moses, they left in haste, taking bread without yeast because they did not have time to wait for it to rise. Each year thereafter, the Jewish people have celebrated Passover by eating unleavened bread and other foods that symbolize this deliverance. In Jesus' day, Passover was celebrated by the Jews in their homes with their family and friends, not in a church or a synagogue. The Passover was celebration of God's deliverance. Jesus used that occasion to institute the Lord's Supper, through which he brings us the blessings of an even greater deliverance. Today, on this Maundy Thursday, we have gathered in church to hear the Word of God. We remember what God has done to rescue us from sin and death.

OLD TESTAMENT READING

Exodus 12:1-12

The LORD said to Moses and Aaron in Egypt, "This month is to be for you the first month, the first month of your year. Tell the whole community of Israel that on the tenth day of this month each man is to take a lamb for his family, one for each household. If any household is too small for a whole lamb, they must share one with their nearest neighbor, having taken into account the number of people there are.

You are to determine the amount of lamb needed in accordance with what each person will eat. The animals you choose must be year-old males without defect, and you may take them from the sheep or the goats. Take care of them until the fourteenth day of the month, when all the members of the community of Israel must slaughter them at twilight. Then they are to take some of the blood and put it on the sides and tops of the doorframes of the houses where they eat the lambs. That same night they are to eat the meat roasted over the fire, along with bitter herbs, and bread made without yeast. Do not eat the meat raw or boiled in water, but roast it over a fire—with the head, legs and internal organs. Do not leave any of it till morning; if some is left till morning, you must burn it. This is how you are to eat it: with your cloak tucked into your belt, your sandals on your feet and your staff in your hand. Eat it in haste; it is the LORD's Passover. "On that same night I will pass through Egypt and strike down every firstborn of both people and animals, and I will bring judgment on all the gods of Egypt. I am the LORD.

Reader: This is the Word of the Lord.

People: Thanks be to God.

EPISTLE READING

Hebrews 12:22-30

But you have come to Mount Zion, to the city of the living God, the heavenly Jerusalem. You have come to thousands upon thousands of angels in joyful assembly, to the church of the firstborn, whose names are written in heaven. You have come to God, the Judge of all, to the spirits of the righteous made perfect, to Jesus the mediator of a new covenant, and to the sprinkled blood that speaks a better word than the blood of Abel. See to it that you do not refuse him who speaks. If they did not escape when they refused him who warned them on earth, how much less will we, if we turn away from him who warns us from heaven? At that time his voice shook the earth, but now he has promised, "Once more I will shake not only the earth but also the heavens." The words "once more" indicate the removing of what can be shaken—that is, created things—so that what cannot be shaken may remain.

Therefore, since we are receiving a kingdom that cannot be shaken, let us be thankful, and so worship God acceptably with reverence and awe, for our "God is a consuming fire."

Reader: This is the Word of the Lord.

HOLY GOSPEL

P: The Holy Gospel according to St. Luke, the twenty-second chapter.

C: Glory to You, O Lord.

He replied, "As you enter the city, a man carrying a jar of water will meet you. Follow him to the house that he enters, and say to the owner of the house, 'The Teacher asks: Where is the guest room, where I may eat the Passover with my disciples?' He will show you a large room upstairs, all furnished. Make preparations there." They left and found things just as Jesus had told them. So they prepared the Passover. When the hour came, Jesus and his apostles reclined at the table. And he said to them, "I have eagerly desired to eat this Passover with you before I suffer. For I tell you, I will not eat it again until it finds fulfillment in the kingdom of God." After taking the cup, he gave thanks and said, "Take this and divide it among you. For I tell you I will not drink again from the fruit of the vine until the kingdom of God comes." And he took bread, gave thanks and broke it, and gave it to them, saying, "This is my body given for you; do this in remembrance of me." In the same way, after the supper he took the cup, saying, "This cup is the new covenant in my blood, which is poured out for you. But the hand of him who is going to betray me is with mine on the table. The Son of Man will go as it has been decreed. But woe to that man who betrays him!" They began to question among themselves which of them it might be who would do this. A dispute also arose among them as to which of them was considered to be greatest.

Pastor: This is the Gospel of the Lord. **People: Praise to You, O Christ.**

NICENE CREED
