Before COVID, a friend and I were talking. Through the conversation I found out that my friend loved to fly and had several friends who owned aircraft. My father, too, owned a plane that we used for all of our family vacations. We had a wonderful conversation about planes and flying. My friend had friends who owned helicopters which have always fascinated me. More than 20 years ago I had been in one. Ever since that day, I have always wanted to go for another helicopter ride. Our conversation was brief, but it rekindled the desire to go flying in a small aircraft. There is nothing like it! The closeness to the ground and the real feeling of flying isn't something you get in a larger jet airliner. A week or so after our conversation, my friend called and asked if I would like to go for a ride in a helicopter. I thought I was dreaming and nearly pinched myself to make sure I was awake. That was months ago, and now that things have calmed down, the opportunity presented itself. So, Cherrie and I were on our way to the airport! The day was perfect for flying. There was light wind and the bright sky was dotted with a few puffy clouds. I felt like it was Christmas morning. I couldn't wait for the helicopter to leave the ground.

As soon as I climbed into the passenger seat, it felt like I had gone back in time to when I used to fly with my father. A smile came across my face as I buckled in, knowing soon I would be flying. There is a sensation you get when an aircraft takes flight that is indescribable, but you know you have left the ground. When I felt it, I had to suppress the want to shout, "Wahoo!"

At first, I only noticed the sound of the engine powering the blades that were keeping us aloft. That was soon replaced by the awe of being able to soar in the sky and look at the world as it passed beneath my feet. As we cruised along at about five hundred feet I was mesmerized by how far you can see. When you are above the trees and buildings it seems like you can see forever. Everything looks different from a few hundred feet above the ground. Your whole perspective changes when you are looking down at something.

As we flew over St. Peter, I thought, wow! It is a big place and how wonderful it looked from above. When we passed over the church, I thought this must be how God sees us. Then I thought, wait a minute, that is not right. God's view is different from what we think. We think God is on His throne in Heaven and He is looking down at us, but that is not even close to what reality is.

John 19:20-21 "On that day you will realize that I am in my Father, and you are in me, and I am in you. Whoever has my commands and keeps them is the one who loves me. The one who loves me will be loved by my Father, and I too will love them and show myself to them."

God is in you! God is not looking down at you, He is going through life with you. God knows where you are, what you are doing, thinking and feeling. There is nothing you will go through on your own. God's perspective is not just from Heaven, it is also from inside you. Now, that changes my perspective, and I hope it does yours as well. God loves you enough to make sure you never go through life alone. God is not only with you, He is in you. (Thank you, my friend, for the helicopter ride.)

July Focus: Faith vs Culture

In the past several years, big tech, the media, and political parties have attempted to silence the Christian voice in the public square. For example, Facebook, Twitter, TV news broadcasts, etc. have worked diligently to remove all mention of anything connected to God's Word and the truth of those words. Giants' are roaming the land...just as they did when Joshua led God's people into the 'promised land'.

Recently, American Family Association has asked citizens to support Fight for Schools, a group of parents pushing to recall six of nine Loudoun County Public School [LCPS] board members. For the second time in as many months, the Loudoun County Public School board has come under fire. This time, teachers and parents are speaking out against the <u>district's policy</u> of requiring staff to recognize and sanction transgenderism by using pronouns that don't fit the biological make-up of students.

Leesburg Elementary teacher Byron "Tanner" Cross addressed the regular LCPS monthly school board meeting about the district's pro-transgender policy. He told the board, "I serve God first and I will not affirm that a biological boy can be a girl and vice versa because it's against my religion. It's lying to a child, it's abuse to a child, and it's sinning against our God."

Two days after telling the school board he would refuse to "lie to [students] regardless of the consequences," the school announced Cross had been put on immediate leave from his duties as a physical education teacher, according to Foxnews.com.

Alliance Defending Freedom Senior Counsel Ryan Bangert said the district's retaliation against the teacher for exercising his rights doesn't only violate the First Amendment's protection of free speech, but also its protection of Americans' right to freely exercise their religious beliefs. "That is a clear and unqualified violation of the First Amendment...All citizens have the right in the First Amendment to speak their mind about proposed government policy. We have the right to redress grievances with our government. We have the right to speak freely on issues of public concern. And that's all Cross was doing."
