### May 2022

Our Mission is to Glorify God by making and growing disciples of Jesus Christ.

May is a big month for the Christian Church because it happens to be the month that almost always includes the celebration of our Lord's Ascension. Unfortunately, the celebration of Jesus' Ascension appears to have gotten lost in the shuffle. What was once considered a celebration that ranked among the big three (Christmas, Easter, and Pentecost), is no longer viewed as it once was.

It's a sad truth because, when it comes to our Lord's Ascension, we are reminded of the Words that He shared with His disciples. Do you remember Jesus' words?

"All authority in heaven and on earth has been given to me. Therefore go and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, and teaching them to obey everything I have commanded you. And surely I am with you always, to the very end of the age." Matthew 28:18-20

We call this the Great Commission but, as has happened to the celebration of Jesus' Ascension, it all too often becomes the great *omission* when we (and so many others) allow our focus to be diverted and distracted by so many other things.

That's why I think this is a great time for all of us to hear a question that I was challenged with several years back at a conference that I attended. That said...I have to warn you because it's a question that is a bit confrontational and it can cause some uneasiness. But, if you're beginning to get to know me then you know I'm going to ask it anyway because I think it's worth asking.

#### "Who will be in heaven because God placed YOU here on earth?"

I admit that I really didn't like the way the question was worded when I first heard it. After all, *people* don't save souls; *JESUS* saves souls. We also know that saving faith comes through the work of the Holy Spirit, not by the works of you or me. And, yet, while these things are true, none of us can get around the fact that the Holy Spirit continues to use people like us to actively respond to Jesus' command to bring His saving and life-changing message to those around us. He has chosen *us* to be the Body of Christ on earth, and His Body (the Church) is all about Jesus' Great Commission to go, make, baptize, and teach more disciples. So...

#### "Who will be in heaven because God placed YOU here on earth?"

It's a great question that should always remain at the very core of who we are and what we're all about at St. Peter Lutheran Church & School. In fact, this question is one that helps keep the focus on our true "mission" – the mission that we've been called to be a part of as followers of the risen, victorious, and ascended Lord Jesus.

#### So, again ... "Who will be in heaven someday because God placed YOU (His mission-driven child) into their life?"

As forgiven and redeemed children of God in Christ Jesus – chosen and claimed by the Holy Spirit to be vital and effective parts of His ever-moving Body, I pray that this becomes a question that drives us here at St. Peter to make Jesus known throughout the Macomb community...and to the ends of the earth.

Fifth Grade Teacher



The following letter was found in the Cornerstone of the original St. Peter Evangelical Lutheran Church, Macomb, Michigan.

This part is to be put in the box for the next generation so they will know how the St. Peter Ev. Lutheran Church was founded. A few families came from Mecklenburg, Germany to this country to make a new start. We all joined the church in Waldenburg as we found the teaching and belief of the Word of God was the same as it was in Germany. It was a long way to Waldenburg so we decided to build our own church.

The congregation was organized and the church was called the St. Peter Ev. Lutheran Church. Officers elected were: Trustees: Johann Schwark, Michael Nicol and Joachim Starck. Elders: Joachim Schwark, Carl Schoof and Christian Brass. It was decided to start building the Church on May 29. The Building Committee: T. Wiese, J. Krugar, J. L. Schwarch, J. Engelbrecht, W. Wangelin, J. Harder, Fr. Witt, J. Hinz and W. Schwarck. On the second Pentecost Day the Cornerstone was laid with church service and prayer as it read in Ephesians 2:20 *"And are built upon the foundation of the Apostles and prophets, Jesus Christ Himself being the chief cornerstone."* 

Let us take home what we have heard today in the sermon and do what we have promised. That is to live up to the teaching of St. Peter Ev. Lutheran Church. We hope that the next generation will follow in our belief, and with the help of God, go through life by reading their Bible and believe in it, pray and trust in the Lord as we are all sinners. Let us remember that Jesus Christ died for us on the cross so that we might live. Let it be Jesus today and tomorrow and forever. Let this be our and your belief at all times with God's help.

We will lay a hymn book in the box that we used in church by singing some lovely hymns, the Augsburg Confession, the Conrad Dietrichscke Catechism and Luther's Small Catechism. In school we received our learning from those books and we hope that you dear followers will teach the Word of God forever.

Glory be to the Father, and the Son, and the Holy Ghost, as it was in the beginning, is now and ever shall be. Amen.

Below is an excerpt from the Right to Life Macomb County North and Northwest Spring 2022 Issue #8 newsletter.

"A petition sponsored by Planned Parenthood, the ACLU, and Michigan Voice for a ballot proposal named "Reproductive Freedom for All" will soon be circulating in your community. This poorly worded petition will attempt to permanently enshrine abortion into our Michigan constitution."

This amendment would affect these existing laws:

- Ban on tax-funded abortions
- Ban on partial abortion
- Required parental consent for children seeking abortions
- Ban on school employees helping children have abortions
- Screening for women being coerced to have abortions
- Licensing and health and safety requirements for abortion facilities
- Informed consent requirement for women seeking abortions
- 24-hour waiting period for abortion
- Requirement that only doctors perform abortion
- Born alive infant protection act
- Michigan's original 1846 and revised 1931 abortion ban
- Ban on human cloning
- · Increased penalties for abortions after viability
- Requirements that women be offered the chance to see an ultrasound before the abortion
- Prenatal protection act that punishes criminals for harming the child before birth along with their mother
- Conscience protections for doctors and nurses who object to performing abortions
- Reporting requirements on abortion statistics and complications
- Michigan surrogate parenting act and a ban on commercialized surrogacy
- Would force elective abortions to be treated the same as childbirth

### TREASURER'S REPORT

### BY BETTY J. YOUNGBLOOD

**<u>BUDGET UPDATE</u>**: Following is a summary of income and expenses, as of February 28, 2022. This information is compared to the same eight-month period of the prior fiscal year (July 2020 through February 2021).

**Church Income** stands at \$1,569,891, compared to \$1,603,990 last year. This is a decrease of 2.1% or \$34,099.

**Church Expenses** now total \$828,382, compared to \$1,297,691. This is a decrease of 36.2% or \$469,309.

**Day School Income** (tuition and miscellaneous income) now totals \$1,227,188, compared to \$774,248 last year. This is an increase of 58.5% or \$452,940.

**Day School Expenses** (salaries, benefits, and expenses) now total \$1,379,681, compared to \$1,088,854 last year. This is an increase of 26.7% or \$290,827.

**Preschool Tuition** now totals \$232,537 while miscellaneous income totals \$131,061, for total income of \$363,597. Miscellaneous income includes a one-time non-budgeted Michigan grant for payroll in the amount of \$127,990.65. We are not reporting income comparisons to last year due to different accounting systems prior to merging the Preschool with the Day School at the beginning of the current fiscal year.

**Preschool Expenses** now total \$220,251. Expenses include salaries, benefits, and related educational items. As with income, we are not reporting expense comparisons to last year due to different accounting systems.

**2022-2023 BUDGET APPROVAL**: The Voters approved a proposed spending guide for 2022-2023 at a meeting on Sunday, April 24, 2022. The spending guide includes total estimated income of \$4,576,100 and total estimated expenses of \$4,770,412.

Though this budget includes a projected deficit, it is probable that some areas will not require all earmarked funding. In three of the past four fiscal years, we have approved deficits but actually achieved surpluses. We expect this also to occur at the end of the current fiscal year.

The approved spending guide for 2022-23 includes two new ministry positions—a Director of Traditional Music and an Associate Pastor for Discipleship. We also project one additional second grade teacher (for a total of three classes) and one and a half custodial positions (currently vacant). In addition, projected spending includes a wage increase for hourly workers and modest cost-of-living increases for full-time staff.
