

Wow, it is hard to believe that it is August already! Before we know it, we will be decorating the tree for Christmas to celebrate our Savior's birth.

However, before we get too far ahead of ourselves, I am reminded that it can certainly feel like time flies with how busy all of our schedules are and how we run our days going from one thing to the next. We may find it hard to actually sit down and see what is going on around us or let God speak to us.

One thing I have found to be true in my life is that it is easier to hear God when I am quiet and still enough to actually listen. In a staff meeting last month, we talked about one of the ways that I was taught how to do that, however, it feels so strange to us because for some people it feels sad! I am talking about going out and sitting down at a restaurant by yourself. This is one of those activities that feels odd. I think in our society today, with constant motion and entertainment, it's incredibly rare to actually have a moment to sit, think, pray, and listen. I think that going out to eat by yourself may present you with that opportunity. Try not to look at your phone and scroll through social media, but actually sit and have a conversation with God. Maybe even just sit and try and listen to Him. Let Him guide your thoughts about what He is doing in your life, or maybe who He is bringing into your life to help you or for you to help them!

We can see in Jesus' life that He showed us that it is important to go and sit and be quiet with God. Think about how many times He went away to pray or to sit alone away from everyone else. I believe this was to model behavior for us that even though we are made for community, we also are made to sit in silence with God, to listen to Him and not all of the loud distracting voices that surround us.

There is a moment described in 1 Kings 19 where the prophet Elijah is wanting to speak to the Lord after he has run away, hiding from Jezebel, and fearing for his life. God sends earthquakes, fire, mighty winds, but His voice was in none of those. Instead, it was in a low gentle whisper. I think that is a lesson for us to remember in times that seem like cataclysmic events. The voice of God often comes in a low whisper. We need to set ourselves up to be able to hear the whisper, however that might be, but it is a skill to learn to be okay with being "bored." By that I mean we need to learn to sit and be still, not needing something to take our attention away all the time. In an age of big, medium, and small screens that can be tough. In fact, on any given night I think many people play a "mini game" of how many screens they can have out and open in front of them.

Remember to let yourself be "bored." Sit in the quiet. Listen for the low whisper of God. It is there where He will meet you.

LCMS WORKER WELLNESS SPECIAL EDITION

PROMOTING WELLNESS in Body and Soul

There are currently 277 parish nurses serving throughout The Lutheran Church—Missouri Synod (LCMS). Most parish nurses — registered nurses who maintain an active license in their state — serve congregations in a volunteer capacity, where they may make home and hospital visits, coordinate volunteers and meal deliveries, provide the occasional healthy snack, and talk through medical situations when needed.

This role is a unique blend of professional nursing and spiritual caregiving. Parish nurses complete specialized training, such as the faith community nursing certificate offered by Concordia University Wisconsin, to learn how to develop holistic congregational health programs within a Christian caregiving framework.

Parish nurses support the work of the pastor by “making sure that nobody falls through the cracks,” says Ronda Anderson, parish nurse at Bethany Lutheran Church, Cedar Rapids, Iowa, and parish nurse representative for LCMS Iowa District East. “The parish nurse works alongside the pastor to provide care for their members and community.”

But parish nurses provide a vital service not only to congregation members, but also to church staff.

Deaconess Christie Hansard has been a parish nurse for 20 years, and she now also serves as the mental health case manager for the LCMS Michigan District. In this role, she answers a confidential phone line that anyone in the district can call. She often helps church workers navigate stress, burnout or setting appropriate boundaries in ministry. Sometimes a pastor or principal will reach out to her for advice on how to help someone else who is struggling with a particular medical or safety issue.

Like all parish nurses, Hansard focuses on wellness in body, mind and spirit of those

around her. She sees her role as being able to triage or assess a situation — something nurses are taught in their training — and then refer people to appropriate resources to help address whatever they are going through. Sometimes that’s a referral to a counselor or medical professional; other times, it means recommending a book or an outside ministry that focuses on a particular topic. She also speaks on wellness topics at events throughout the district and is involved with district conferences.

Parish nurses are “definitely a bridge between the medical community and the church,” Hansard said. “Assessment and advocacy are the biggest skills that we can utilize for our church workers in trusting, therapeutic, Christ-centered care.”

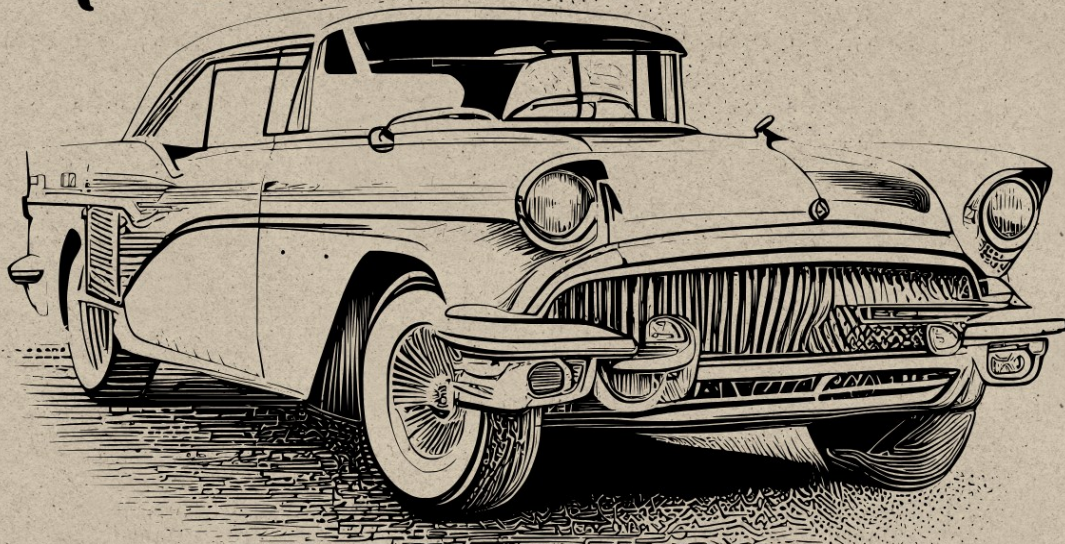

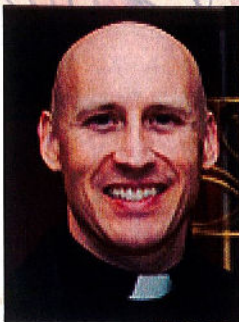

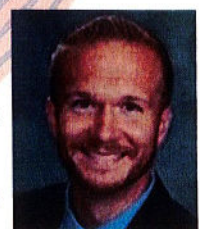
